Early Childhood Centre Rippa Tournament

4 Mini Tournaments are being held next week for 10 Early Childhood Centre's from Carterton and Masterton. Wairarapa Bush U16 (18) vs Wellington U16 (19) Development

A stirring comeback. With 10 minutes to play and 13 points behind on the scoreboard, the Wellington U16 Development team showed grit and resilience to score two converted tries and win their pre-season fixture 19-18.

Played in cool and heavy conditions, the game was a forward dominated battle, with Wairarapa-Bush having the best of the opening 35 minutes, leading 13-5 at halftime. The steady easterly breeze off the Castlepoint hills provided a territorial advantage to the visitors in the second-half.







Last week in Paeroa on the Hauraki plains there was a rugby occasion that went mostly unnoticed by Wairarapa Rugby fans but it did not go unnoticed by Referees within this province. Our very own Alistair Payne became the first Wairarapa Bush referee since Steve Hannam way back in October 1997 to referee a first class championship match.

Alistair controlled the fixture between the playing through champions, Mid Canterbury, and the Pride of Paeroa, the Thames Valley Swamp Foxes. And his performance on the field in his first championship appointment was quickly followed by some well earned praise from players, spectators and local referees alike. 
