Last weekend saw the WBRU host two referees from the Marlborough Rugby Union and, in exchange, we sent Dean Goodin and Gary Hall down to Blenheim to referee.

Each year we also exchanges referees with the Far North Coast Rugby Union in New South Wales. This year Graeme Reisima will be making that trip to control games over a ten day period.

All Referee Associations in New Zealand have Interchanges with other Associations. Every Year the Wellington Union sends referees to Australia, Hong Kong, Japan, Dubai and Samoa as well as all around New Zealand.

Interchanges provide great occasions to socialise with other referees and renew old acquaintances. But the main purpose of those trips is to put referees into games where they are completely unfamiliar with the players, teams, styles of play, jersey colours, the grounds and even the changing facilities. All these unfamiliar surroundings take the referee out of his comfort zone and provide a challenging environment.

Referees, like players and officials, can become a little blasé from constantly being in the same surroundings and dealing with the same people. Teaching the referee to operate with precision under testing and stressful situations is essential to the overall development of the referee. Interchanges provide some of those conditions by taking them away from their home turf.

This week I watched the two Marlborough referees control fixtures at Memorial Park and they both preformed very well. But before the games, they were both like cats on the proverbial hot tin roof. They were feeling the stress and they were being put to the test. They met that test and will be better referees as a result. Dean, Gary and Graeme will show us those benefits when they return.

You watch – I will be.
