And central to our interest in how players perform will be our own Representative side. Heartland Rugby starts this week with a really tough encounter against the King Country. King Country always starts the season and we have them up first and it's a challenge that has to be met.

And a challenge that has been laid down to Referees this year by the NZ Rugby Administrators is to better and more consistently manage these first class fixtures. To help they have asked refs to follow five guidelines.

- 1/ Manage the Game Fundamentals so that the game is tidy and easy to watch.
- 2/ Create positive play at Set Piece so that the game restarts occur quickly and provide quality ball.
- 3/ That the breakdown/tackle is managed in a balanced fashion so that both sides have a fair opportunity to contest for the ball.
- 4/ To give the Ball receiving team as much clear space as the rules allow so that they play the game they want to play.
- 5/ Referees are encouraged to be good communicators and make their decisions easily understood and clearly communicated to players and spectators alike.

It looks simple written down. I hope all of our referees can deliver.

You watch them. I will be.


