They say a week is a long time in politics and I am equally certain that the same applies to a “week in NZ Rugby”. Last week the AB’s were being criticised for their poor performances. International Referees were the scourge of the masses and the butt of criticism and our Heartland Team was being paraded as a possible championship contender.

And what has happened in the past week is a reminder to us all that one poor performance shouldn’t stain the character of the team, the player or the official. And neither should one excellent performance mark a team, player or official as being a world beater. Most often the vitriolic criticism or the enthusiastic praise is so emotionally infused that it is hard to see in hindsight where the basis for that view came from.

And that is so true about this Pink Batts Heartland Championship. Whilst we might wish and hope that our rep team wins everything, anyone who has studied Heartland Rugby knows that playing King Country in their backyard in the first-up round is an enormous challenge for a developing rugby team.

Just look at last week’s results. Not one of the Home Teams lost. Why? Because travelling to play rugby is something that players need to get used to. It’s awkward, uncomfortable and takes young men out of their comfort zones. It’s enormously difficult for our players to be at their best until they start to relax into the “travel away -play-travel home” cycle. And that’s the Home Team’s advantage.

Don’t lose heart. This week we are at home. I’ll be interested to see if we can exploit that advantage. I hope so, I’ll be watching. I want you to do the same.
