Wairarapa-Bush Legend Passes Away



FAREWELL: Ian Turley notched up 147 first-class games for his province.

A Wairarapa man who excelled as a rugby player, a devoted family man and who survived a major lung operation nearly 20 years ago has died. Ian Turley, 69, was a junior All Black, an All Black triallist and a Wairarapa-Bush rugby stalwart who notched up 147 first-class games for his province.

The rangy lock forward wrote his way into Wairarapa-Bush rugby folklore on a cold, inhospitable Wairarapa day in 1977 when he laid down the law to his opposite number when Wairarapa-Bush hosted the British Lions. Nigel Horton was deemed to be cheating and Turley dished out some summary justice which saw Horton get by far the worst of the deal.

Ian Turley though was known for more than just rugby.

He contracted a disease called anti-trypsin deficiency, a genetic disorder that ate away at his lungs, and underwent a lung transplant operation at Greenlane Hospital in Auckland in 1996. His recovery was described as being remarkable due to Mr Turley's determination to regain his health.

He is survived by his wife Miriam, three adult children and three grandchildren.

This last weekend I attended the New Zealand Rugby Referee Development Squad Seminar in Wellington. The referees in the Development Squad will control Heartland Rugby fixtures this season.

It was two days of talking refereeing. It would probably bore the tears out of most rugby fans but I loved it. I've been referee coaching for 18 years and involved with 1st class referee coaching for 12 years. I am constantly learning more about the game and the manner in which it is best controlled. This weekend was no different.

But my lasting memory from the weekend came from a 2 hour session that the Referees had with the Heartland Provincial Coaches who were also in town for their annual seminar. The NZ Rugby High Performance Managers ran a session during which coaches had to answer law questions and act out referee signals.

Very few managed to get a 'pass' mark. It was a genuine eye opener for the coaches. But at the same time I was reminded that our game is coached and played instinctively in NZ and that very few people involved in the game know the detail of the Laws. Certainly only a very few know as much as the man in the middle - the referee.

After discussing the complexity of one offside scenario, a long standing coach declared he would never criticise another referee in his life.

Big ask? Impossible task? Perhaps not! Perhaps it was the realisation that both jobs in rugby are entirely different and that we should leave each other to ply our craft without unwarranted criticism. In fact closer collaboration would probably get the greatest gain for our sport. Big ask? Impossible task? Perhaps not.
