QUINNY'S CORNER

THE TACKLE – PART 2 - the Continuing Explanation.

Two weeks ago when I left the description of the **TACKLE**, the ball was on the ground; players who were on the ground were rolling away and a competition for possession was about to take place. SO what happens next?

Before a RUCK has been formed, the TACKLER(s) and the TACKLED PLAYER, once they are on their feet, may immediately use their hands to compete for the ball on the ground. The Tackling Assistants – remember, they are the ones who didn't go to ground – may also use their hands to compete for the ball but must first go to their side of the tackle and enter the tackle-area from behind the players on the ground. This entranceway is called 'The Gate'.

And if any of these players choose not to compete for the ball, they must immediately move away from the tackle-area without hampering other players.

Any **Arriving Player** must only enter the contest after first going "through the gate".

And now the tricky part. If any player gets his hands on the ball **BEFORE** a ruck has formed, he can continue to use his hands even after the ruck commences. So it is a split second thing. Did he get his hands on the ball before the ruck started? This is often the source of most disagreement over the accuracy / consistency of the referee management at tackle, because if the player is too slow, he is handling the ball in the ruck and liable for penalty.

Next week -: When does a tackle end and a ruck or maul commence? What about the requirement for the tackled player to release the ball when there is an opponent above him?
