

Commentators can hear every word the referee says. And every piece of action is on slow motion replay when required. In previous seasons, with more than just a hint of bias and with the benefit of multiple replays, many commentators have conveyed disdain and despair that a referee's decision was wrong or a judgement was flawed.



But it is my perception that things are changing in the broadcasting box? Are our TV people starting to ease up on officials? They seem to be less critical and more supportive. Is my perception right? I hope so. Perhaps they are learning something about the game.

One of the greatest Test Referees of all time, Clive Norling of Wales, once told me that his perfect game would be the match where he would make only four errors during the 80 minutes and that he hoped that they would be spread evenly across each of the four quarters of the match.

Referees have never had a belief or an expectation that they would get it right all of the time. So why do the supporters demand absolute perfection from refs? Refs don't demand it of themselves and certainly don't demand it from the players. And now seemingly, commentators are seeing things from a referee's point of view.
