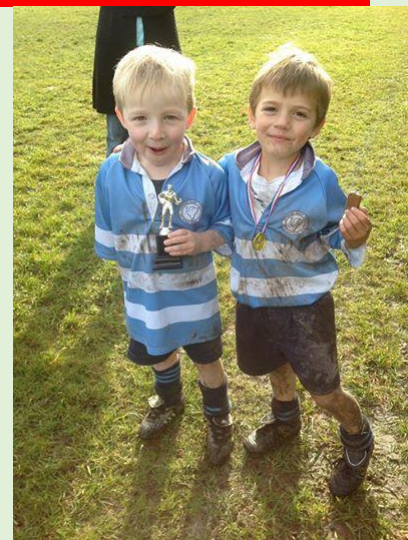

Bear with me readers as I step you through events that happened on Saturday.

Five minutes into the second half of the Greytown V East Coast match, GREYTOWN 1, a prop, is sin binned. At the next scrum, the GREYTOWN Captain nominates GREYTOWN 7 to leave the field so that GREYTOWN 22, a reserve prop, can come into the game to complete their front row.

5 minutes after the Sin Bin, GREYTOWN 18, a flanker, is required to leave the field to stem blood streaming from his nose. GREYTOWN Temporarily Replace him with GREYTOWN 7 who was the nominated player who left the field following the sin bin of GREYTOWN 1. This Temporary Replacement is permitted by IRB Law Clarification 4-2005.

At the end of the 10 minute Sin Bin, GREYTOWN 1 returns to the game and GREYTOWN 22, the temporary front row replacement, leaves the field. He could have stayed there because now GREYTOWN still only have 14 players on the field.

Greytown request further time for GREYTOWN 18 to recover from his nose bleed and ask to put another Temporary Replacement onto the field to bring their numbers up to 15. But because the blood flow from GREYTOWN 18 has been stemmed the request is declined. GREYTOWN 18 MUST return to the field immediately the blood flow has been stemmed. He has 15 minutes to stem the flow but once stopped, he MUST be presented to the AR to return to the field immediately.

GREYTOWN are a little slow to respond and the game resumes. They play for a further 60 seconds with only 14 players whilst GREYTOWN 18 waits on the sideline for a stoppage in play.

It's not easy managing the game of rugby. You watch. I will be.

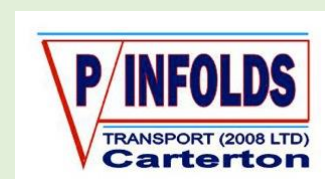
